#### **Responsibilities:**

The General Manager is expected to guide the District to achieve strong operating results while striving for growth and expansion in a fiscally responsible manner subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Directors. The successful candidate will be a proven leader that has held progressive leadership positions within highly matrixed environments. The General Manager position requires the ability to manage a large, labor-intensive workforce. It is preferred that the General Manager candidate possess experience in a public administration executive position where there is significant importance placed on collaboration with political officials; local, state and federal governmental entities; civic and business leaders; property owners, constituents, and the ability to manage a large labor-intensive workforce.

# About Jefferson County Drainage District No. 6

Established in 1920, Jefferson County Drainage District No. 6 serves Beaumont, Bevil Oaks, China, Nome and the communities of Fannett, Northwest Forest, Hillebrandt Acres, Cheek and LaBelle as well as farm and timber land in Jefferson County, Texas. The District controls storm and flood waters from rivers, streams and ditches, and drains and reclaims overflowed lands.

The District is governed by a 5-member Board of Directors appointed by the Jefferson County Commissioners Court for 4-year terms. The General Manager/Chief Operating Officer reports to the this 5-member board.

The District services approximately 40% of northern Jefferson County, an area almost 1/2 the size of the state of Rhode Island. Within this area there are over 1091 linear miles of streams, ditches and outfalls, all under the jurisdiction and control of the District.

Since the inception of the District, Jefferson County has relinquished most of its flood control and drainage activities to the District for those properties located within the District's boundaries. All incorporated and unincorporated areas rely heavily on the District to provide outfall drainage and flood relief.

The District's responsibility consists of maintaining and constructing large outfalls, cutoffs, gullies, streams and bayous that accept runoff collected through municipal and other local drainage systems and transport it out of the area. This is accomplished using a Master Drainage Plan which utilizes channelization and detention techniques to relieve flooding in critical areas.

In addition to the above, the District carries out daily preventive maintenance which includes grass and weed cutting, application of herbicides in agricultural areas, ditch cleanouts, care of concrete linings, earthen channel rectification and many other activities which protect and improve the environment.

The District employs 90 permanent employees and approximately 68 temporaries. The District has a budget of approximately \$39 million. The tax base has a \$19,235,619,668 market value, with \$14,613,281,327 taxable. Currently, the District has grant awards totaling over \$110 million.
